Religious leaders, welfare workers and medical staff spoke out at a charity lunch for a stricken hospital in Iraq.

The event, at Anam's restaurant in Great Horton Road on Sunday, was organised by the Bradford-based Human Relief Foundation.

The £30,000 raised went to the Al-Yarmook hospital in Baghdad which serves around four million Iraqis.

Mobeen Azhal, from the charity group, said the centre was woefully short of medicine and equipment following years of sanctions and the crippling effects of the recent war.
