They are holding a family fun day between 1pm and 3pm at the Odsal Stadium on Sunday - the start of the World Club Challenge week - in aid of the Arthritis Research Campaign.

Families will be invited to walk around the stadium and meet players from both sides. Bulls media manager Stuart Duffy said: "Arthritis is, of course, a disease that many professional sportsmen and women may face after they retire."

"Work and research to find ways of improving their quality of life is

something we fully support. We are all looking forward to the game against Penrith at the McAlpine Stadium on the 13th and we hope many of our supporters will take this opportunity to meet some of the stars of what promises to be a show-piece occasion."

The aim is to give families a chance to meet and walk with the stars, as well as encouraging walking as a form of exercise.

Kathryn Leverett, area appeals manager for the Arthritis Research Campaign, said: "It is wonderful to be involved in this great event. Inactivity is the worst thing for joints - even if they are painful."

Children help out Teacher training

Schoolchildren have raised more than £5,000 for Human Relief Foundation welfare projects in Iraq, Kashmir and the Palestinian territories.

Pupils at Belle-Vue Boys, Byron Primary, Carlton Bolling College, Cophorne Primary, Farnham Primary, Lilycroft Primary, Margaret McMillan Primary and Westbourne Primary, distributed envelopes and held non-uniform days to raise the money.

The project co-ordinator of the Bradford-based group, Yousaf Razaq, said: "Regardless of age most people want to do something to help when they are exposed to the reality of poverty."

"The money will go a long way in relieving the suffering of children afflicted with poverty."

"The projects that are carried out with the money will be a continual testament to the hard work of all parents, teachers and students who have been involved."

The Human Relief Foundation was established in 1991 in response to the first Gulf War. Since then HRF has worked on a multitude of projects in more than 40 countries.

Three schools in the area have linked with a Horsforth college to offer teacher training in the classroom for graduates.

Leeds School-Centered Initial Teacher Training has been accredited by the Teacher Training Agency. St Mary's Roman Catholic Comprehensive School in Menston, Guiseley School and Horsforth School, alongside five other Leeds schools, will work in partnership with Trinity & All Saints College.

The scheme will offer a one-year course leading to qualified teacher status and a Post-Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE).

Starting in September 2004, the courses are open to graduates wishing to teach art, design and technology, ICT, music or science to secondary age pupils.

As a school-centered programme, trainees will have the opportunity to learn while working alongside experienced staff.
